65TH GRAND CHAPTER

Mu Chapter receives its second consecutive Rock Chapter Award

Nine collegiate members and six alumni from Mu Chapter were in attendance at the 65th Grand Chapter of Sigma Nu Fraternity, held July 4 - 7 at the Fairmont Hotel in Dallas, Texas.

Alumnus Bobby Woods (Mu 2300) led the Grand Chapter in the Pledge of Allegiance during the Opening Ceremonies on Wednesday. Woods, an Army Captain and Airborne Ranger, was gravely wounded when his platoon was ambushed by insurgents in Afghanistan in 2010.

Later that evening, Mu Chapter was awarded its second consecutive Rock Chapter Award, which is the highest honor bestowed upon collegiate chapters by the Fraternity. To be eligible for the award, a chapter must achieve and maintain excellence across a broad range of areas of chapter operations including service and philanthropy, brother and alumni development, recruitment and manpower, governance and accountability, and campus leadership. Mu Chapter was one of nine to receive the award, out of over 170 collegiate chapters nationwide.

On Thursday, alumnus John Hearn (Mu 2000) was unanimously elected one of four Vice Regents and will serve a two-year term on the Fraternity's High Council, or Board of Directors. Moreover, Hearn was named the Alumnus of the Biennium, an award given to the alumnus "whose active participation in the affairs of the Fraternity has been a noteworthy example, and whose persona traits, demonstrated leadership, involvement, and overall achievement mark him as one who has contributed to the excellence of Sigma Nu."

In addition to serving as a longtime advisor to Mu Chapter, Hearn chaired Task Force Hopkins, a committee of the Fraternity's best operators charged with creating the Best Practices Library, a collection of hundreds of best practices from collegiate chapters nationwide.

He was joined in this endeavor by alumnus Michael Barry (Mu 2071), another longtime advisor to Mu Chapter. The two also served as Grand Sentinels during the past biennium, and Hearn chaired the Chapter Eternal Committee for the Grand Chapter.

During the Closing Ceremonies on Saturday, collegiate member Wells Ellenberg (Mu 2400) was named Sigma Nu's Man of the Year. The award is given to the collegian who has demonstrated excellence in leadership. Ellenberg follows in the footsteps of two previous Man-of-the-Year Award recipients from Mu Chapter: alumni Tom Johnson (Mu 1232) and Stuart Smith (Mu 1821).

In addition to serving as the immediate-past Commander of Mu Chapter, Ellenberg is one of four Collegiate Grand Councilmen on the Fraternity's High Council. He recently completed a one-year term as the sole voting student member on the University of Georgia Athletic Association Board of Directors. Additionally, he was named the 2012 Patrick Hues Mell Leadership Scholar by alumnus Luther Lockwood (Mu 1901), who chairs the University of Georgia Foundation scholarship endowment.

Finally, alumnus Robert Durham (Mu 1650) concluded his two-year term as Regent, or National President, of Sigma Nu. Under his leadership, collegiate chapters were reminded of and expected to uphold their "Obligation to Excellence." In order to help them do so, Regent Durham appointed Task Force Hopkins and announced the creation of the Best Practices Library. In addition to his exceptional State of the Fraternity report, a record nine chapters received Rock Chapter Awards this biennium, further testament to Regent Durham's vision and courage.

To recognize the outstanding work by Regent Durham throughout his membership in Sigma Nu, the active chapter announced the Robert E. Durham Medal of Excellence. The award will be given each semester to the graduating senior "who, through his vision and courage, consistently demonstrates a commitment to excellence, and whose actions on behalf of Sigma Nu Fraternity and the University of Georgia provide a worthy example for others to follow." At Grand Chapter, Regent Durham was presented with a framed medal, which was minted in the United States on the same press as the Congressional Medal of Honor.

Mu Chapter raises thousands for American Heart Association

The "clean, old fashioned hate" of the Georgia-Georgia Tech rivalry once again took the form of a competitive philanthropic event between Sigma Nu's Mu and Gamma Alpha Chapters.

Nearly thirty runners from Mu Chapter met the Gamma Alpha Chapter at the Historic Gwinett Courthouse in Lawrenceville, Georgia. They each then took turns running the game ball for one or two miles at a time, led by police escort, until they eventually completed the seventy-mile journey to Sanford Stadium in Athens.

This year's event was organized by Mu Chapter Philanthropy Chairman Chris Brandus, a junior journalism major from Alpharetta, Georgia. "I have always enjoyed this event, and it was a true honor to help organize everything this year," said Brandus. "I am proud of Mu Chapter for lending a helping hand to those in need."

Each chapter raised money through donations from individuals and small businesses. This year, Mu Chapter is set to raise \$10,000 for the American Heart Association, a non-profit organization dedicated to building healthier lives free of cardiovascular disease and stroke. The donation will be made through the Fraternity's partnership with the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award, which is given annually to the top NCAA head football coach.
